*** Adequate sound system provided. Music must be on CD and delivered to the announcer at least three hours before the start of the class.

Management reserves the right to split, cancel or change the day of classes or ride times to balance unusual amounts of entries and/or scratches. Updated schedules will be posted at the end of each competition day at the office. Entries will be accepted only when they are correctly filled in, signed by all necessary parties and accompanied by payment in full of all applicable fees. No faxed entries will be accepted.

5. STABLING (continued)

Temporary vinyl stalls, 9.6 x 9.6 with doors in tents. **Stall fees:** \$185 per stall/tack stall for all three days+ \$35/extra day. (Thursday night through Sunday end of competition day.) Stall assignments will be available after 10 a.m. Thursday. No bedding provided but will be available for purchase at posted hours. A \$55.00 Non Showing horse fee will be charged to each horse stabled on the grounds but not entered in the show. Haul-in fee-\$50 per day. Walk-in fee- \$25 per horse / day. Stallions will be given special attention. Show secretary must be notified if arriving after 6p.m.

Any unapproved stabling change will incur a \$200 fine to the owner of the horse in question!

STALL SHAVINGS - SPECIAL NOTICE!

Missy Sage of the Equine Nanny will be providing shavings for sale during the competition. Plus, if you wish, you may order shavings in advance to be delivered to your assigned stall prior to the competition. All pre-orders must be in by March 19, 2010.

NANNY WATCH SERVICE

We have stewards monitoring the stables 24 hours, but if you would like a little extra TLC for your horses, call on The Equine Nanny. For only \$10 per night, their service includes hourly watch of horse (9 p.m. until 6 a.m.) with a personal stall chart marked each hour for the horse. Hay will be given if owner would like between 9 p.m. and 10 p.m. Water is checked and filled at midnight, with the amount of water consumed recorded, and morning feed will be given at 5:30 a.m. For arrangements for this service, call the Equine Nanny.

Four 20 x 60 m. improved sand base competition rings. Three 20 x 60 m. improved sand base warm-up rings.

8. DIRECTIONS

From north, take Okeechobee Blvd. (State Road 704) or from the south take Southern Blvd. (State Road 80) west to Seminole Pratt Whitney Rd. Turn right and go north to Sycamore Lane. Turn left and follow to the entrance of Horse Park at Equestrian Estates and the show grounds. (At the White Fences gate, the road jogs slightly right then continues straight ahead.) Turn left into the show grounds and parking.

ADULT AMATEUR NATIONAL CHAMPION SERIES AWARDS

Established in 2009, the National Champion Series Awards is for Adult Amateur riders who compete at both the Palm Beach Dressage Derby, CDI-W/Y (in the Open show) and Dressage at Equestrian Estates. Riders must enter both shows to qualify. The awards will be presented on Sunday afternoon, April 4, 2010 during a special ceremony and photo session.

Adult Amateur High Score Grand Prix

A new perpetual trophy has been established for the Adult Amateur High Score at the Grand Prix. The winner will receive \$500, a trophy, ribbon and championship sash. In addition, their name will be added to the perpetual trophy.

High Score Level Awards

All winners will receive a trophy, ribbon and championship sash. Training Level through Fourth Level will also receive \$100. Prix St. Georges/Intermediaire I Level will receive \$250.

Check the Derby web site for complete rules, etc. Riders must have scores from both the Palm Beach Dressage Derby and Dressage at Equestrian Estates in order to qualify for the awards.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

GR301.5: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individual in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.



ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, United States Equestrian Federation) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
